The Reverend James Nailton Coleman (brief autobiography)

My name is James Nailton Coleman son of the late Minie Nathan and Charles D. Coleman. I was born in Lloyd Ville, Grand Bassa County, Liberia, West Africa. I grew up and went to school in Monrovia, Liberia. Having completed my high school education I pursued and received a diploma in Pastoral theology from Monrovia Bible Institute and College. I also attended the Methodist University Gbarnga School of Theology in Monrovia and completed a Bachelor's degree in Theology.

My technical studies have included welding as trade in Japan and South Korea. I have studied Dies and Tools and received certification in that area in India. In the United States I have continued to add to my skills by attending Penco Tech receiving a diploma for Auto body repair, welding and a separate study in electricians.

In the past I have served as a full time Pastor:

I was ordained by the Wesleyan Church of Liberia in 1995.

I served as assistant Pastor for Locamtown Wesleyan Church.

Then I became Senior Pastor for Srocklcreek Wesleyan Church.

I was District Superintendent and later Head District superintendent for the Wesleyan Church of Liberia.

I then served as Country Director for World Hope International of Liberia and also as the Director for the Elisabeth Crawford and Matthew R. Walker Schools. I also worked with The Religious Crusade Prayer Band of Liberia.
